Landcare Mentoring Pilot in Yarram Yarram Network, 2018

A mentoring program is being piloted across Yarram Yarram and South Gippsland Landcare Networks. The 12-month program will match landholders in the area with mentors to develop sustainable land management goals and action plans. Mentors will receive training to provide effective support and guidance to mentees.

Mentors will share their experience and networks with mentees to help them achieve their goals. The lessons learnt from the pilot will be shared to explore how mentoring can be more formally integrated into the Landcare culture.

This project will connect landowners with experienced locals who can support them, and direct them to the most suitable experts in the local agencies such as WGCMA, DELWP, DEDJDR, water authorities, local government and other farmers.

These new landowners will develop and implement farm action plans that meet their goals that initiate land and environmental outcomes and build confidence for further action. Mentors will act as a vital sounding board for landowners by assisting in the development of these plans.

The project will begin with a workshop on **Saturday 20th October** at Toora Hotel for Mentee where you will meet other mentees, explore their personal goals, meet the mentors. We are looking for people keen to develop their property and fast track their learning.

How long will the program run for? – This is a pilot program and will run from October 2018 to October 2019.

Who decides the mentees who will be selected? –The project organisers will carefully consider all applications.

Are there any other expectations? –This program will run for 12 months. We will run training in October 2018. You will then be matched with mentors in October. We expect mentors to visit mentees properties and mentees to visit mentors as they work through mentees plans and work towards property goals. This will be discussed on the training day.

Yarram Yarram Landcare Network hope to build the culture of mentoring into their Landcare ethic. We will be keen to look at how we can improve and develop the program and will be asking for your ideas and feedback during this exciting first step.
